Vedda Indigenous People In Dambana

Experience local engagement with the Vedda, an indigenous group in Sri Lanka. The Vedda people are one of the oldest ethnic groups in Sri Lanka, known for their unique culture and traditions. Walk to their village, visit a mud hut, and enjoy a healthy Ayurvedic drink with jaggery. Learn how they hunt using bows and arrows, and observe their traditional method of making fire by rubbing stones. Witness their ritual dances accompanied by songs. This session is held away from typical tourist areas, offering a unique opportunity to engage with their lifestyle without other tourist groups around.



Cultural Dancing Academy In Gadaladenyia

Experience local engagement with a traditional dance instructor by learning traditional Sinhalese dances. There are three main styles of Sri Lankan classical dance: the Kandyan dances of the hill country region, the low country dances of the southern region, and the Sabaragamuwa dances of the Ratnapura region. These classical dance forms differ in their body movements, gestures, and the shape and size of the drums used. You'll have the opportunity to master the basic steps of these significant dance styles, and additionally, you'll learn to play the relevant drum rhythms for each.



Bonding With An Elephant In Sigiriya

Experience local engagement with a mahout, the elephant handler, in caring for a captive elephant. Assist in feeding these majestic creatures, enjoy the bonding experience of bathing them, and take a memorable walk alongside the elephant. These domesticated elephants are incredibly friendly and offer wonderful opportunities for memorable photos with these magnificent animals. However, we do not encourage riding the elephants, as we prioritize their well-being and comfort. Instead, we invite you to engage with them in respectful and enriching ways, ensuring a positive experience for both you and the elephants



Tea Workers' Village In Dambethenna

Experience local engagement with Tamil tea workers' villages by strolling around their colorful, quaint houses. Sri Lankan tea workers are primarily Indian Tamils, brought by the British during the colonial period to work on plantations. These villages are among the most economically deprived in Sri Lanka. Walking through the village, you may encounter underprivileged children; offering chocolates, sweets, or school stationery can bring them joy, and witnessing their smiles in response to your kindness is gratifying. Additionally, you can visit a nearby Hindu temple to admire statues of gods and other deities.



Tea Pluckers On Tea Field In Dambethenna

Experience local engagement with traditional tea pluckers by witnessing how they expertly pick young green tea leaves each morning. The task of plucking tea is traditionally done by women, who carefully hand-pick the leaves to ensure the highest quality. Hand-plucking allows workers to select only the top two leaves and a bud from the tea plant, which are the freshest and tenderest parts. You can dress in traditional sarees, just like the tea pluckers, and step into the lush, green tea fields, where you'll be introduced to the age-old skill of selecting only the most tender tea leaves.



Rural Hindu School In Dambethenna

Experience local engagement with underprivileged Hindu school students by visiting a rural school and witnessing firsthand the challenges they face due to a lack of learning facilities. These schools serve communities with limited resources, where families may struggle to meet basic needs. With permission from the school principal, you can visit a classroom, share a small, entertaining English lesson, sing with the students, and enjoy a joyful time in their classroom. Offering school stationery and educational aids can bring immense happiness to these children, who face financial constraints in their education.



Child Monks Piriven Education Temple In Kandy

Experience local engagement with young Buddhist monks by visiting a monastic Pirivena school, which provides education for little monks and novices, focusing on spiritual and academic subjects. The main function of the Pirivena is to teach classical subjects such as Sinhala, Pali, and Sanskrit, as well as Buddhism, history, and Logic. At the school, you can observe how they learn the Pali language, literature, culture, and traditions. Additionally, you can share a small, entertaining English lesson with the young monks to bring joy to their day. You can also engage in serving breakfast among them by adding your own food.



Stilt Fishermen In Koggala

Experience local engagement with traditional stilt fishermen by visiting a roadside fishing spot during sunrise or sunset. Stilt fishermen are a unique sight found along the southern coast of Sri Lanka. This traditional fishing method involves fishermen sitting on wooden poles, known as stilts, anchored in shallow waters. The fishermen maintain a balanced position on the stilt while casting their lines to catch fish. You can also try this ancient fishing method yourself by sitting on perched vertical poles with crossbars, using a traditional fishing rod to catch small fish and truly immerse in the experience.



A Tuk Tuk Ride Through Green Valley In Haputale

Experience local engagement with a Tuk Tuk driver by traveling in his vibrant vehicle while taking in the spectacular views of the mountains and tea fields. The small, open vehicle provides an up close view of landscapes, from mist covered mountains to neatly arranged tea plantations. As the Tuk Tuk winds through narrow roads, you feel a cool breeze, and with every turn, a picturesque scene is revealed. The gentle bouncing over uneven roads adds to the thrill while the driver shares stories about the area. If you build rapport, you might even get the exciting opportunity to try your hand at driving the Tuk Tuk yourself



Clay Pottery Family In Menikhinna

Experience local engagement with a clay pottery maker and learn the art of transforming raw clay into beautiful pottery using traditional methods and equipment. The roots of pottery in Sri Lanka trace back to ancient times, and traditionally, pottery was functional, with items created for daily use, including cooking pots. Small families are involved in the pottery industry, with practices passed down through generations. These families have a long-standing tradition of pottery-making, where skills are taught from parents to children. You can try your hand at shaping raw clay using hands and a pottery wheel.



Sinhalese Traditional Village In Sigiriya

Experience local engagement with villagers and village life by taking a leisurely walk through the village. Agriculture is the backbone of village life, and families work together to cultivate land. Food in Sri Lankan villages is simple yet flavorful, often prepared using fresh ingredients from local gardens. Rice and curry form the staple diet, accompanied by lentils and fish. In the village, you can participate in a cooking demonstration and try your hand at preparing traditional dishes. Enjoy the rewarding experience of savoring the meals you've created while gaining a deeper understanding of culinary traditions.



Scenic Train Journey From Ella To Kandy

Experience a scenic train journey through the beautiful mountains of tropical Sri Lanka. The views on both sides of the tracks are spectacular, showcasing lush landscapes and vibrant greenery. The train winds through hills, providing glimpses of farms, villages, and vast tea plantations. If you step into third class, you will have the chance to interact with locals who enjoy chatting. Leaning out of the train door provides some of the best views and an exhilarating feeling, but be cautious. Avoid extending your limbs outside the train at the wrong moment, as low-hanging trees and tunnels pose danger.



Giragama Tea Factory In Pilimathalawa

Experience learning everything about Ceylon tea while witnessing the step-by-step manufacturing process. Sri Lanka is famous for its high-quality tea and has a long history of cultivation dating back to the 19th century. Inside the tea factory, the step-by-step tea-making process can be seen. Fresh tea leaves are first withered to reduce moisture, then rolled to release natural oils. The leaves are fermented to develop flavor and color before being dried to stop oxidation. After drying, the leaves are sorted by quality. High-quality factory-made Sri Lankan tea, known for its rich taste and aroma, can be purchased.



Wild Elephant Jeep Safari In Minneriya

Experience the wild elephant jeep safari in Minneriya National Park, where you'll witness the splendid sight of around 150 to 200 majestic Sri Lankan elephants gathering in wide grass fields. As you traverse the park's landscapes, you'll encounter herds of elephants, often led by protective matriarchs, surrounded by playful calves who stick close to their mothers for guidance and safety. As evening falls, the elephants become more active, engaging in playful displays, trumpeting, and socializing with one another. This unique safari offers an unforgettable opportunity to observe these magnificent creatures in their habitat.



Ancient Ruined City In Polonnaruwa

Experience walking through the ancient city of Polonnaruwa, a site rich in historical significance. Polonnaruwa was once the capital of Sri Lanka from the 11th to 13th centuries and is now recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Explore ancient Buddha statues, massive stupas, and fascinating structures from the era of kings. You can accompany a young monk from a nearby temple, capturing photographs of the monk in front of grand statues and stupas, adding life to these backdrops. Many local devotees visit these temples, and you can also engage with friendly locals who are happy to share their experiences.



Ancient Rock Fortress In Sigiriya

Experience climbing the ancient rock fortress of Sigiriya. This site of historical significance is dominated by a massive granite column approximately 180 meters high. Sigiriya features the ruins of an upper palace on the flat top, a mid level terrace with the Lion Gate and mirror wall frescoes, and lower palaces clinging to the slopes below. As you ascend, you'll encounter beautifully preserved frescoes depicting celestial maidens, providing a glimpse into the artistic talent of the time. The views from the summit offer a unique perspective of the lush jungles and distant mountains, creating a sense of tranquility.
