Sri Lanka's Indigenous Veddas' In Dambana

The Vedda people are one of the oldest ethnic groups in Sri Lanka, known for their unique culture, hunting practices, and traditions dating back to before the 6th century BCE. Today, they live in regular houses and huts, with only a few still maintaining the traditional long hair, attire, and beards. This session is set up with a few Indigenous people for a photo session in their small hut and the surrounding area, which is away from the regular touristic Vedda village nearby, where no tourists are around. This is an organized photo session capturing the aboriginal appearance of the Veddas and their traditional culture.



PHOTOGRAPHY HIGHLIGHTS

Stilt Fishermen In Koggala

Stilt fishing is a method unique to the island of Sri Lanka. Fishermen sit on a crossbar tied to a vertical pole driven into the sand a few meters offshore. This technique is mainly practiced during March to April when fish are abundant. This session is set up with a few stilt fishermen, selecting the best poles to sit against the sunrise or sunset to create a perfect silhouette, while also ensuring a steady position for long exposure photographs of the fishermen and the still water. This is an organized photo session capturing traditional fishermen in silhouette style and their fishing method at dusk or dawn with colorful sky lights.



PHOTOGRAPHY HIGHLIGHTS

Ancient Ruins And Monks In Polonnaruwa

The Ancient City of Polonnaruwa in Sri Lanka is a historic site that was once the capital of the country during the 11th to 13th centuries. It is known for its well preserved ruins, including palaces, temples, and statues. This session is set up with special permission from the Department of Archaeology to enter the ruins at sunrise, with no tourists allowed at this time, and includes featuring young Buddhist monks for the photo session. This is an organized photo session capturing ancient architecture of Sri Lanka, adding liveliness to the ruins by photographing young Buddhist monks in front of them.

Pettah Market In Colombo

Pettah Market is a busy and colorful market known for its wide variety of goods. It is a large area with many small streets, where traders sell items like fresh fruits, vegetables, spices, and many more. Each street is often focused on one type of product, making it easy to find what you need. The market is full of activity, with people buying and selling goods throughout the day. Pettah is not only a key trading center but also a reflection of the island's diverse. This is a candid photo session capturing the market's vibrant atmosphere, focusing on the actions of hard workers and the emotions reflected in their close up faces.

Fishing Village In Negombo

Negombo fishing village is a small, bustling coastal village with a lot of fishing activities in the morning. Each morning, the beach comes alive as fishermen return with their catches, which are then laid out for sorting, drying, or selling at the local fish market. Colorful boats dot the shoreline, and fishing nets are spread out to dry under the sun, adding to the village's charm. The market is especially lively, with locals haggling over a variety of fish. This is a candid photo session capturing the fishing village's vibrant atmosphere, focusing on the actions of fishermen and the emotions reflected in their close-up faces.



PHOTOGRAPHY HIGHLIGHTS

Tea Pluckers On Tea Field In Dambethenna

The task of plucking tea is traditionally done by women, who expertly pluck by hand to ensure the highest quality of leaves. Hand plucking allows workers to select only the top two leaves and a bud from the tea plant. The work is physically demanding, as tea pluckers spend long hours in the fields, moving through rows of bushes. In Sri Lanka, pluckers gather 15 to 20 kilograms of tea leaves daily. This is a candid photo session capturing the portraits of tea pluckers in the tea fields, showcasing their colorful clothes and traditional tea plucking methods used to process Ceylon tea.



PHOTOGRAPHY HIGHLIGHTS

Tea Workers' Village In Dambethenna

Sri Lankan tea workers are primarily Indian Tamils, brought by the British during the colonial period to work on plantations. Many of these workers were transported from southern India to meet the labor demands of the burgeoning tea industry, which became a major export commodity. Today, the descendants of these laborers continue to reside in tea plantation villages, often among the most economically deprived areas in the country. This is a candid photo session capturing close up portraits of the villagers, especially children, who live in very basic line houses that provide a colorful backdrop.

Dambulla Famers Market In Dambulla

Dambulla farmers market is one of Sri Lanka's largest wholesale markets for fresh produce, serving as a hub for vegetables and fruits. Each day, farmers, traders, and suppliers arrive with a variety of goods, filling the marketplace with produce from leafy greens and tomatoes to bananas, mangoes, and other fruits. The market becomes especially active in the morning and evening as trucks loaded with freshly harvested produce line up to unload. This is a candid photo session capturing the market's vibrant atmosphere, focusing on the actions of hard workers and the emotions reflected in their close up faces.



PHOTOGRAPHY HIGHLIGHTS

Traditional Dancers In Polonnaruwa

There are three main styles of Sri Lankan classical dance: the Kandyan dances of the hill country, the low country dances of the southern region, and the Sabaragamuwa dances of the Ratnapura region. These classical dance forms differ in their movements and the shape of the drums used. This session is set up with a few Sri Lankan traditional dancers and drummers in costumes from a dancing academy, bringing them to a nearby rock and requesting some dance performances and poses. This is an organized photo session capturing the dance poses of Sri Lankan traditional dancers in colorful costumes.

Jeep Safari At Minneriya National Park In Minneriya (Half Day Safari)

Minneriya national park, where you'll witness the splendid sight of around 80 to 100 majestic Sri Lankan elephants gathering in grass fields and near the reservoir. As you traverse the park's landscapes, you'll encounter herds of elephants, often led by protective matriarchs, surrounded by playful calves who stick close to their mothers for guidance and safety. As evening falls, the elephants become more active, engaging in playful displays, trumpeting, and socializing with one another. This unique safari offers an unforgettable opportunity to observe these magnificent creatures in their natural habitat.

Seema Malaka Temple And Skyscrapers In Colombo

Seema Malaka is a peaceful Buddhist temple in Beira lake in Colombo. It is a small but beautiful temple, built on a floating platform surrounded by calm waters. From this peaceful spot, a different side of Colombo can be seen, the modern skyline filled with tall skyscrapers. Looking from Seema Malaka, the view of Colombo's skyscrapers is breathtaking. Some of the most famous skyscrapers in Colombo can be seen from here, including the Lotus Tower, luxury hotels, and apartment buildings. The Lotus Tower is the tallest structure in Sri Lanka, with a unique shape inspired by a lotus flower, and its green and purple colors make it stand out.

Avoid extending your limbs outside the train at the wrong moment, as low-hanging trees and tunnels pose danger.

A Tuk Tuk Ride Through Green Valley In Haputale

The Tuk Tuk ride through the green valley in Haputale offers a unique experience with stunning natural beauty. The small, open vehicle provides an up close view of the surrounding landscapes, from mist covered mountains to neatly arranged tea plantations. As the Tuk Tuk winds through narrow roads, you feel a cool breeze, and with every turn, a picturesque scene is revealed. The gentle bouncing over uneven roads adds to the thrill, while the friendly driver shares stories about the area. The ride passes through tea workers' villages, where you observe daily routines and see school kids walking to school.

Galle Fort And Surroundings In Galle

Galle is a city rich in history, culture, and stunning architecture. One of its most famous landmarks is Galle fort, a UNESCO world heritage site originally built by the Portuguese in the 16th century and later fortified by the Dutch. The Galle lighthouse, one of Sri Lanka's oldest and most scenic, stands inside the fort, overlooking the turquoise waters of the Indian ocean. Beyond the fort, Galle offers some interesting places to visit. Nearby, the Japanese peace pagoda provides a tranquil setting with panoramic coastal views. The Rajgama Wella fish market has a lively atmosphere where fishermen bring in the day's catch.

Japanese Peace Pagoda In Rumassala

Built in 2005 by a Japanese organization dedicated to promoting peace and non-violence worldwide, the pagoda serves as a poignant reminder of the devastating consequences of war and a call for universal harmony. It is part of a global network of peace pagodas, established to inspire unity among all people, regardless of nationality or religion.
